Requesting Volunteers

The many successful events and fun school activities held by Scoil Nuachabháil have been supported by parents who have provided their time, hard work and outstanding baking skills. The P.A. have requested volunteers for different events from a range of school class parents, in an effort to 'spread the burden'. We have made an effort to keep track of those who have assisted to date in the hope not to call upon them again!

Rather than sending out a request to the whole school for baking or assistance for every event we have decided to use the following process for requesting volunteers and their baking donations during our term as the P.A.

For the Junior Infant Open Day, we will ask current Junior Infants parents for baking donations and their assistance on the day.

For the Second-Class Communion after party we will ask the current Third-class parents for baking donations and their assistance on the day.

For the Graduation night we will ask the current Fifth class parents for baking donations and their assistance on the night.

For any other events such as the Sports Day or the official school opening, we will contact (through the school) parents from the other classes in the school.

We hope that this will reduce the volunteer requests as much as possible. We hope not to have to call upon the same people more than once. However, by all means, we are delighted if people are willing to assist in more than one event.

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The Annual School Bake Sale which is usually held before Easter is the only event where we will have to send out a request to the whole school for baking as it is our largest fundraising event in the year.
